If you already have a Will and would like to include a gift to The Queen Alexandra Hospital Home you may like to fill in this Codicil form.

What you need to do:

- Ensure that you and two witnesses have signed and dated the Form.
- Keep the Codicil with (but not attached to) your current Will.
- Send, or give a copy of the Will and Codicil to your Executor with a note indicating where the original is held.
- Either consult with or send this form with a covering letter to your Solicitor.
- If your Will already has Codicils it is best to see your Solicitor to avoid any confusion.
- Do not write on or amend your current Will as this could invalidate it.
